Uphold EU, AU and RECs commitments on SRHR



Progressing to a **knowledge-based economy** and putting **skilled human capital** at the heart of **Africa's agenda** is essential for building the continent's strategic autonomy, strength and resilience to address major challenges

- Encourage exchanges and develop partnerships between universities;
- Boost human development, notably through scaling up mobility and employability;
- Invest in inclusive and equitable quality education;
- Promote opportunity oriented technical and professional Vocational Education and Training, including at regional level.



Priorities for Culture

Promote more effective EU cultural cooperation in a changing geopolitical context by working towards:

1. A common cultural space and market: enable cooperation and co-production between African and European cultural sectors and industries

2. A more coordinated approach: synergies with Member States actors and programmes (bilateral cooperation etc.) and with intra-EU programmes (e.g. Creative Europe, Media)

3. Enhance cooperation and exchange among African and European museums to protect and promote cultural heritage and arts (*Dakar Declaration, April 2023*)
