Launch of Disability Employment Campaign and Employability Project: Promoting Formal Employment of Persons with Disabilities

Dar es Salaam, 22nd September 2011

The European Union and its partners CEFA, Radar Development and CCBRT launched on 22nd September at the Terrace, Slipway, a media campaign to promote the formal employment of persons with disabilities. The campaign, mainly funded by the European Union and CBM, focuses on the great potential and abilities of persons with disabilities and the added value they bring to the workplace. It involves TV and radio spots broadcasting, billboards and print media and will run for the coming three months.

A survey among 126 companies based in Dar es Salaam undertaken last year in collaboration with the Tanzanian Trade Union for Industries and Commerce (TUICO) showed that persons with disabilities are under-represented in the formal employment sector. Awareness among employers on the abilities of persons with disabilities was low as well as on applicable national legislation and standards, yet the commitment to engage in inclusive practices was evident.

The **Disability Employment Campaign** responds to these findings by calling upon employers to make their workplaces more inclusive. The host of the event, His Excellency Tim Clarke, Ambassador of the European Union, called upon employers to take action and stressed that: "There are long-term benefits in having a work place free from discrimination and one which promotes diversity: these enhance the profitability of the company and of the individual employees."

The Government has taken important steps in promoting an inclusive society by ratifying in 2009 the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities and domesticating it through the enactment of the Persons with Disabilities Act 2010. Deputy Minister for Labour and Employment, Hon. Dr. Makongoro Mahanga, on behalf of the guest of honour Hon. Gaudensia Kabaka, Minister for Labour and Employment, urged all employers to implement the Act and reminded the audience of the provision the Act makes on employment, namely that "all employers with 20 or more employees have to reserve at least 3% of the registered jobs for persons with disabilities."

On the same occasion the guest of honoured also blessed the official launch of the '*EmployAbility*' project, a 600 million Tshworth initiative implemented by CCBRT and Radar Development in collaboration with TUICO and the Government of Tanzania to ensure specialised disability recruitment and inclusive workplace consulting services are available to all employers and candidates employees with disabilities across Tanzania. Built on the successes of previous collaborations between the European Union, CEFA, Radar, CCBRT and the Tanzanian Trade Union for Industries and Commerce (TUICO) the project is set to make a tangible contribution towards a more inclusive and fair society.

With support from the European Union and the Irish NGO Disability Aid Abroad, Radar and CCBRT will offer dedicated recruitment services for persons with disabilities and support employers to undertake disability audits, make recruitment processes accessible and undertake the necessary adaptations in the work place.

The Tanzanian Trade Union for Industries and Commerce (TUICO) has already fully embraced the initiative and established a disability committee to support its members with disabilities.
